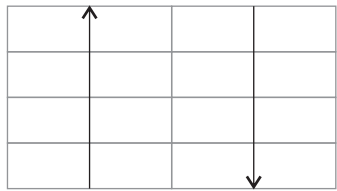
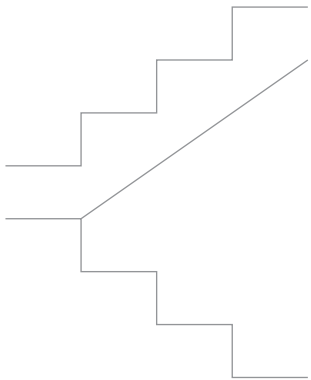


Situation with side-mounted glass installation when two adjacent flights of stairs are build next to each other.

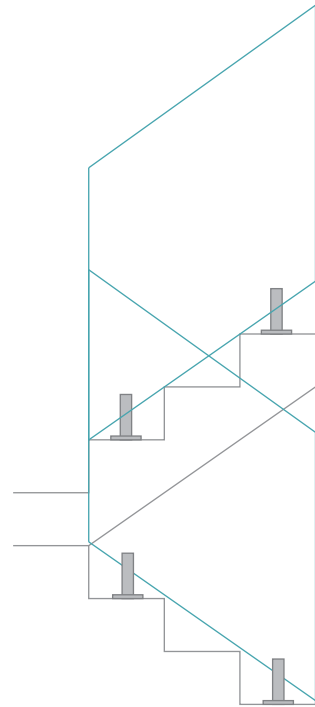


Top View

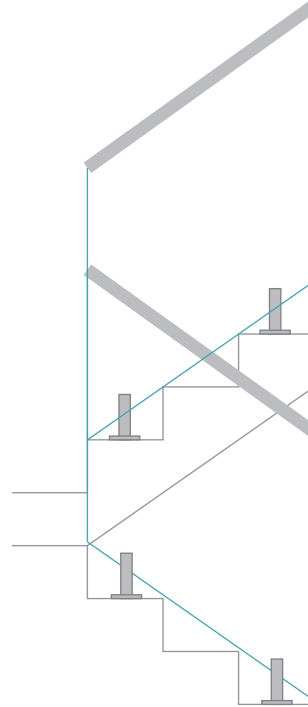


Side View

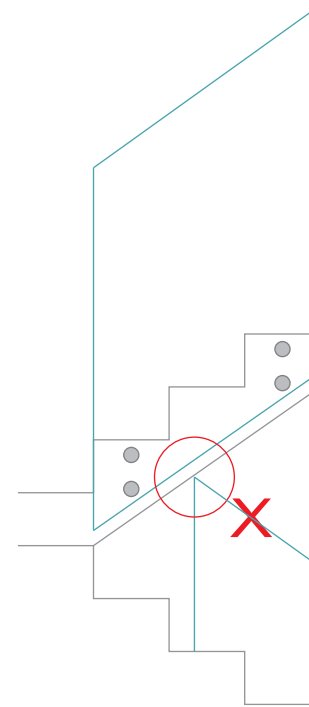
When we have a staircase that looks like this. A side-mounted glass installation might be limited.



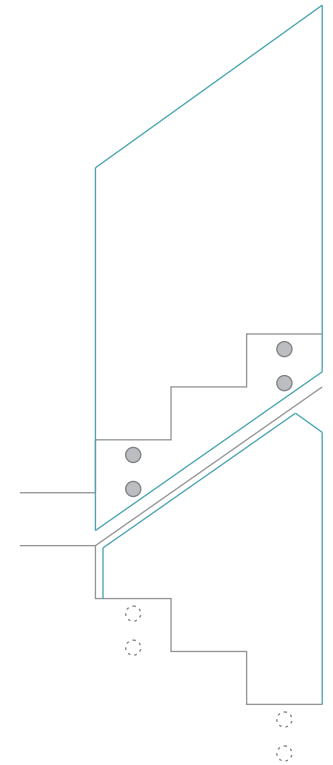
A top-mounted system like the spigots will be mounted on the stairs and the guardrail could be installed on the threads all the way from the first step to the landing.



That will also allow the glass to have a top cap rail that will also serve as a handrail.



A side-mounted system like the standoffs won't allow the glass panels to go all the way to the landing because the bottom part of the next flight of stairs will be in the way.



This situation will require a special designed panel that will have a cut on top to match the bottom of the next flight.

This won't allow top cap rails to be used as handrails since they won't be able to come from first step to landing. This will require handrails on the other side.
